

- Harmonised role and competences of infrastructure managers
- End to "privileged relationships" (more competition in traction services)
- EU-level safety certification
- Limits to "national rules"
- Genuine European interoperability

Legal Framework for Rail Infrastructure

Rail Freight Corridors

- One-stop-shop for train paths (but not more complexity)
- Guaranteed capacity for freight
- Barrier-free border-crossing
- Performance enhancement: Corridor-level key performance indicators
- Clear traffic-management priorities
 - Freight train speeds up to 120km/h
 - High speed trains on high/speed tracks
- Projected lack of terminal capacity ("by 2017-18" DIOMIS Project)
- Open access terminals: transparent conditions of use (included in Network) Statements)
- Authorised applicants part of supervisory bodies (like Terminal Managers)





Priorities: TEN-T Guidelines

Development and Funding

- > Elimination of bottlenecks
- > Harmonised train-length, maximum gross weight and profile gauge
- EU level coordination of development: Connecting Europe Facility
- Corridor-management: minimisation of disturbances around works

Quality and Accountability



- Transparency
 - Collection and publishing of relevant rail statistics
 - > Benchmarking of performance indicators (punctuality, average speed)
- Clarity and harmonisation in track access charging: in noise differentiated TAC
- IT Solutions
 - > eFreight: Modernised Customs Code paperless customs
 - > TAFTSI: access to data also granted to CT Operators


